I welcome you to the Summer 2018 / 2019 edition of ACHA News

It is with great pride that I write to you as the CEO, Hospital Operations for Adelaide Community Healthcare Alliance Incorporated (ACHA) for the first time.

I would firstly like to acknowledge the recent retirements of Mr Alan Lane, previous CEO, Hospital Operations / ACHA and Mr Mike Terlet AO, previous Chairman / ACHA Board.

Mr Alan Lane elected to retire on 31 August 2018 after 14 years' of service. Alan joined ACHA in 2004 and has had a very distinguished career in healthcare spanning more than three decades in hospitals, pharmacy and pathology. Alan was influential in shaping ACHA's strategy and establishing a sustainable business framework. He progressed many improvements and projects during his tenure, in particular the development projects currently underway at Ashford Hospital and The Memorial Hospital.

December 2017 saw the announcement and commencement of the development projects for both Ashford Hospital and The Memorial Hospital.

The \$67 million project includes the addition of new operating theatres, creation of new and expanded clinical facilities such as the Day Procedure Unit (Ashford Hospital) and the Paediatric Day Stay Unit (The Memorial Hospital), refurbishment of 130 patient rooms and ensuites and many other improvements across the two hospitals. Flinders Private Hospital have also completed a number of exciting projects including the conversion of a procedure room to an operating theatre and the addition of more car parking spaces for patients and visitors. There are more details provided on page 18.



Credentialing and Defining the Scope of Clinical Practice

During 2018 the ACHA MAC has:

- Reviewed the scope of practice in Breast and Endocrine Surgery
- Conducted a clinical practice audit of Dental Surgery and Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery

- 49 VMOs were audited against their accredited scope of practice and procedures performed
- 2 of the 49 VMOs required further review, however this showed these VMOs had appropriate education and registration to conduct the procedures undertaken
- Overall the audit showed 100% compliance of procedures performed against the approved scope of clinical practice, for the VMOs audited

During 2018, the MAC considered 589 applications from VMOs, of which:

- 195 were applications for initial credentialing
- 388 were renewal applications for re-credentialing
- 5 were variations to scope of practice for credentialing
- 34 required further review prior to credentialing being approved

The MAC would like to sincerely thank the over 1400 VMOs credentialed at the ACHA hospitals, for their ongoing support and contribution.

New Interventional Procedures

A **New Interventional Procedure** is defined as a procedure not previously performed within that particular ACHA facility. This will include variations on an existing procedure and treatment where a new device, equipment or medication is introduced and which employs a significantly different technique or technology to those previously used.

During 2018, the MAC considered the following applications for the conducting of new interventional procedures:

- Hip Revision Implants
- Reintroduction of MitraClip®
- Review of Faecal Transplant

The New Interventional Procedures policy and application form can be obtained from any ACHA hospital. As much prior notification that is able to be provided to the hospital General Manager would be appreciated.

Trans-Vaginal Mesh - Credentialing Requirements

During October 2017 the Therapeutics Goods Administration (TGA) have acknowledged that all pelvic mesh devices available in Australia will be classified high risk and women will receive patient cards with details of the mesh device used.

In November 2017, the TGA put out a safety alert to advise on actions after its review into urogynaecological surgical mesh implants. The TGA decided to remove Trans-Vaginal Mesh products whose sole use is the treatment of pelvic organ prolapse via Trans-Vaginal Implantation from the Australian Register of Therapeutic Goods. To date 45 devices have been removed from urogynaecological use, these conditions took effect on 4 January 2018.

On the 27 March 2018 the Senate Enquiry Report was released into the public domain, details included:

- Senate Enquiry made 13 recommendations, including the Governments advice on the credentialing of VMOs who perform surgery using Trans-Vaginal Mesh products
- Australian Commission on Safety and Quality in Health Care (ACSQHC) developed Credentialing Guidelines for Surgeons inserting and removing Trans-Vaginal Mesh implants

The ACHA MAC have recommended that each Specialist in Obstetrics and Gynaecology accredited with ACHA be informed of the ACSQHC recommendations, and follow the requirements of the credentialing process as per the guidelines.

Commonwealth Department of Health - ACOR - TAVI Registry

The Commonwealth Department of Health has authorised the Australian & New Zealand Society of Cardiac & Thoracic Surgeons (ANZSCTS) and the Cardiac Society of Australia and New Zealand (CSANZ) to develop the processes and criteria for the accreditation of TAVI practitioners and carry out the accreditation, reaccreditation and deaccreditation of those practitioners.

As part of the process, TAVI practitioners are required to submit data to the National TAVI Registry. For TAVI practitioners to submit data to the registry:

- Practitioners who perform TAVIs and hospitals where TAVIs is conducted must be registered with the Commonwealth Department of Health
- Each TAVI must be reported to the ACOR Registry under this direction

Both Ashford Hospital and Flinders Private Hospital are registered with ACOR for TAVIs to be conducted at the hospitals, and a number of ACHA Credentialed Practitioners are also registered to be able to conduct the procedure at these sites.

BACK TO BEDSIDE

ACHA has rolled out a new patient centred care strategy, 'Back to Bedside'.



Exceptional Care. Every Patient. Every Time.

The strategy focuses on getting our staff back to the bedside and engaging with teams about how we can improve our processes. Back to Bedside includes the following components:

 Rework - Removal of wasted time and rework from processes.

Several projects have targeted the most commonly mentioned issues, such as mandatory training and day surgery paperwork.

2. **Always Events** – 5 key behaviours that patients tell us most impact their experience.

For direct care nurses, these are:

- Standard communication
- Patient rounding
- Bedside handover
- Patient care boards
- Above and Beyond

Each role and each layer of management has their own always events. For managers it also includes rounding and reward / recognition.

More communication will be shared about this strategy as we progress. We welcome VMO involvement and feedback.

ACHA PATIENT FINDER

Designed for family and friends to track the location of a patient during their stay, Patient Finder was rolled out across ACHA in 2016. The app provides updates on location information of the patient through theatre, recovery and return to the ward. The use of the app is controlled primarily by the patient who can forward their unique code to the Patient Finder app to their family and friends. The patient's location details including ward names, room number and in some cases phone extension are included within the Patient Finder app. If a patient changes ward or rooms during their hospital stay, Patient Finder will immediately update all location information.

There are two simple ways to access Patient Finder.

 In most cases prior to the hospital admission a SMS is sent to the registered mobile number with a unique link to the Patient Finder app. The patient simply forwards this SMS to all desired family and friends. When the link in the SMS is clicked the Patient Finder app will open on any device and display all key location details.

OR

2. The hospital reception team will supply each patient with a Patient Finder card that includes their admission number as well as a web address and QR code that can be used to gain access to the app. The patient can give this card or pass on the admission number and web address to all family and friends to track the patient throughout their hospital stay.

FROM THE GENERAL MANAGER

The Ashford Hospital development project is progressing well and I am pleased to provide you with an update.

Following the completion of the early works from December 2017 - April 2018, Schiavello Construction (SA) Pty Ltd were appointed to undertake the next stage of our development. This commenced on 2 June 2018 and included:

- Refurbishment of main entrance with a new pharmacy and reception area
- Creation of new six bed Chest Pain Unit on the first floor

This stage was completed on schedule in early October 2018 and a celebration was held for our VMOs, staff and volunteers on 3 October 2018. The new Chest Pain Unit was utilised for patients from 9 October 2018.

The current stage of works includes:

- Upgrade and expansion of Day Procedure Unit
- Creation of new cafe on Marleston Avenue

The new Day Procedure Unit will more than double its capacity from 14 chairs to 30 chairs. The facilities will be designed, constructed and integrated to provide enhanced care and support for our patients. Stage 1 of the Day Procedure Unit is expected to be complete by the end of April 2019.

The new Hudsons cafe will have a street front position on Marleston Avenue, enabling customers to conveniently access the cafe from the outside of the hospital. It is expected to be opened by January 2019.

This development project will represent a significant milestone in the hospitals history and we look forward to updating you on the project as we progress.

We recognise that the building works has caused some challenges for our VMOs and staff as we strive to continue to provide quality care to our patients.

We sincerely thank you for your patience and cooperation throughout the project.

Ashford Hospital values the contribution of all of our VMOs, staff and volunteers. I thank you for the quality of care you provide to our patients, your support during 2018 and for your ongoing commitment to Ashford Hospital.

DEVELOPMENT PLAN

The \$33 million development of Ashford Hospital commenced on 27 December 2017 and includes:

- More than doubling in size and upgrade of the Day Procedure Unit from 14 chairs to 30 chairs
- New additional operating theatre and refurbishment of the patient recovery area (completed April 2018)
- New six bed Chest Pain Unit (completed October 2018)
- Refurbishment of patient accommodation and wards
- Refurbishment of main entrance with new cafe, pharmacy and reception (Stage 1 completed October 2018)
- Significant infrastructure and support services upgrades

The addition of the new operating theatre, a robotic focused theatre, was completed in April 2018 and has been in demand by our VMOs with the theatre schedule at capacity. The works also included:

- Upgrades to other existing operating theatres and recovery
- Theatre furniture, fixtures and equipment (FFE)
- Replacement of mechanical services (air conditioning)
- Upgrade to fire systems

The opening of the six bed Chest Pain Unit on 3 October 2018, based on the first floor, was an exciting milestone for our cardiac staff. The Acute Cardiac Unit will be relocated to the adjacent ward on the first floor, Marion Ward, next year following completion of required electrical and monitoring upgrades. The Medical Oncology and Haematology patients will relocate to the ground floor giving this group of our patient's private accommodation with access to the court yard.

The doubling of our Day Procedure Unit will significantly improve our efficiencies and achieve a streamlined patient journey. The upgrades to the patient accommodation and wards will also enhance the entire patient experience.

In addition to the expansion of clinical services and improvement of patient facilities this project will also include significant infrastructure upgrades that will greatly assist the ongoing energy security at the hospital.

We appreciate your patience and flexibility during this project. Works are expected to take approximately 18 months to complete.



ROBOTIC SURGERY AT FLINDERS PRIVATE HOSPITAL

Medrobotics expanded the use of the Flex® Robotic System to provide robot-assisted control of the Flex® Colorectal Drive during visualisation and surgical site access to the anus, rectum and distal colon.

The Flex® Robotic System is also used by Otorhinolaryngologists to treat benign and malignant disease of the oropharynx and larynx as well as sleep apnoea surgery. The Flex® Robotic System gives Surgeons the ability to access anatomical locations that were previously difficult or impossible to reach minimally invasively.


